Capitol Subcommittee Meeting Report Wyoming's U.S. Semiquincentennial Task Force January 30, 2024

The Capitol Subcommittee met on January 30, 2024. Attending were Kari Gray (Chair), Riana Davidson, Wendy Madsen, Nick Neylon, Mike O'Donnell, Sara Sheen, and Diane Shober.

The committee determined that we would focus on various events and activities beginning July 2025 and continuing through July 2026 with a culminating celebration at the Capitol on July 4, 2026. The committee brainstormed ideas which can be refined and expanded when a theme is determined. Wendy and Riana compiled a list of the lead-in activities identified by the committee and also a list of activities that could potentially take place on July 4, 2026, at the Capitol. The potential July 4 activities were separated into outside and inside events. Finally, the committee considered Capitol complex tie-in events to include the Wyoming Supreme Court, the State Museum, the Historic Governor's Mansion, and the Union Pacific Depot. The compilation of the committee's ideas are attached to this report. The committee recognizes that the compiled list does not currently address the months between January and June of 2026. Certain activities span more than one month, additional activities may be added, and existing ideas may be retimed to account for gaps. At the same time, the committee believes the activities should gradually intensify as the culmination approaches, and early months are expected to have less activity.

Certain committee members had significant roles in the Capitol Re-opening Celebration. This is fortuitous because they have access to logistical planning and budget materials. These members are currently reconfiguring those materials as the foundation and budget for use in this project. Our next meeting is scheduled for March 19, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. We look forward to incorporating any input from the Committee of the Whole.
